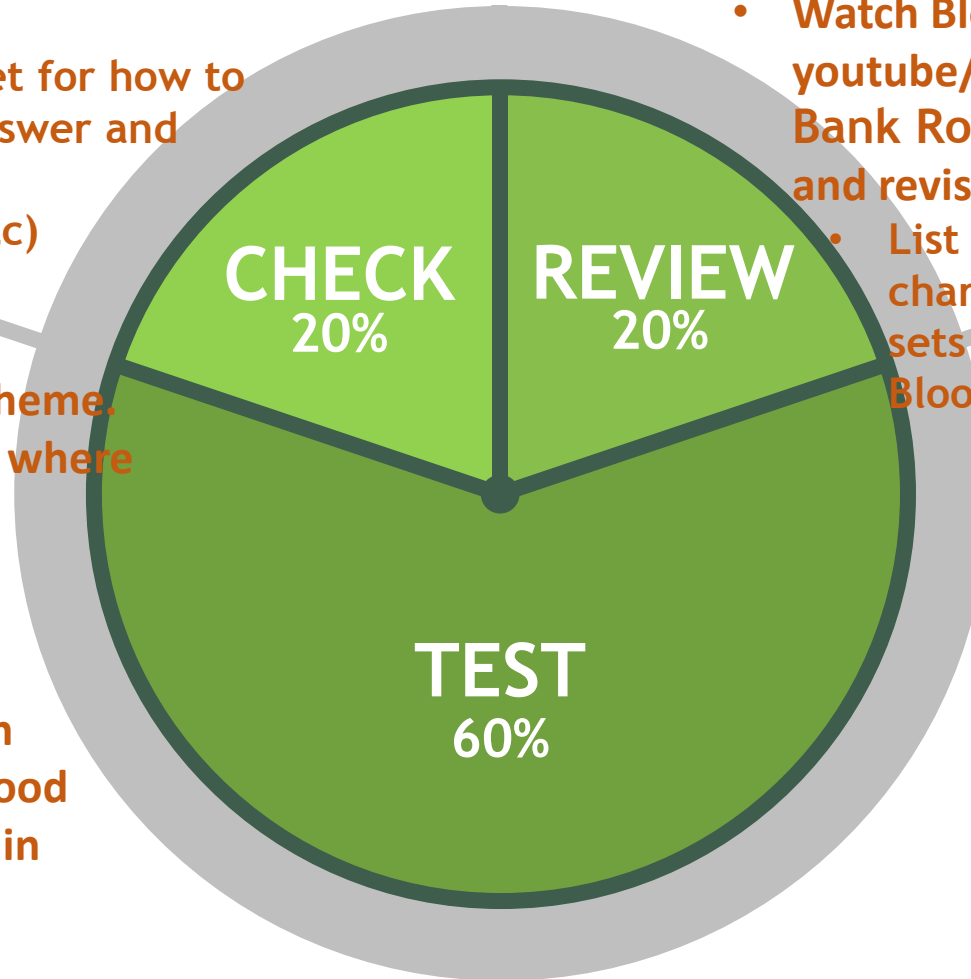

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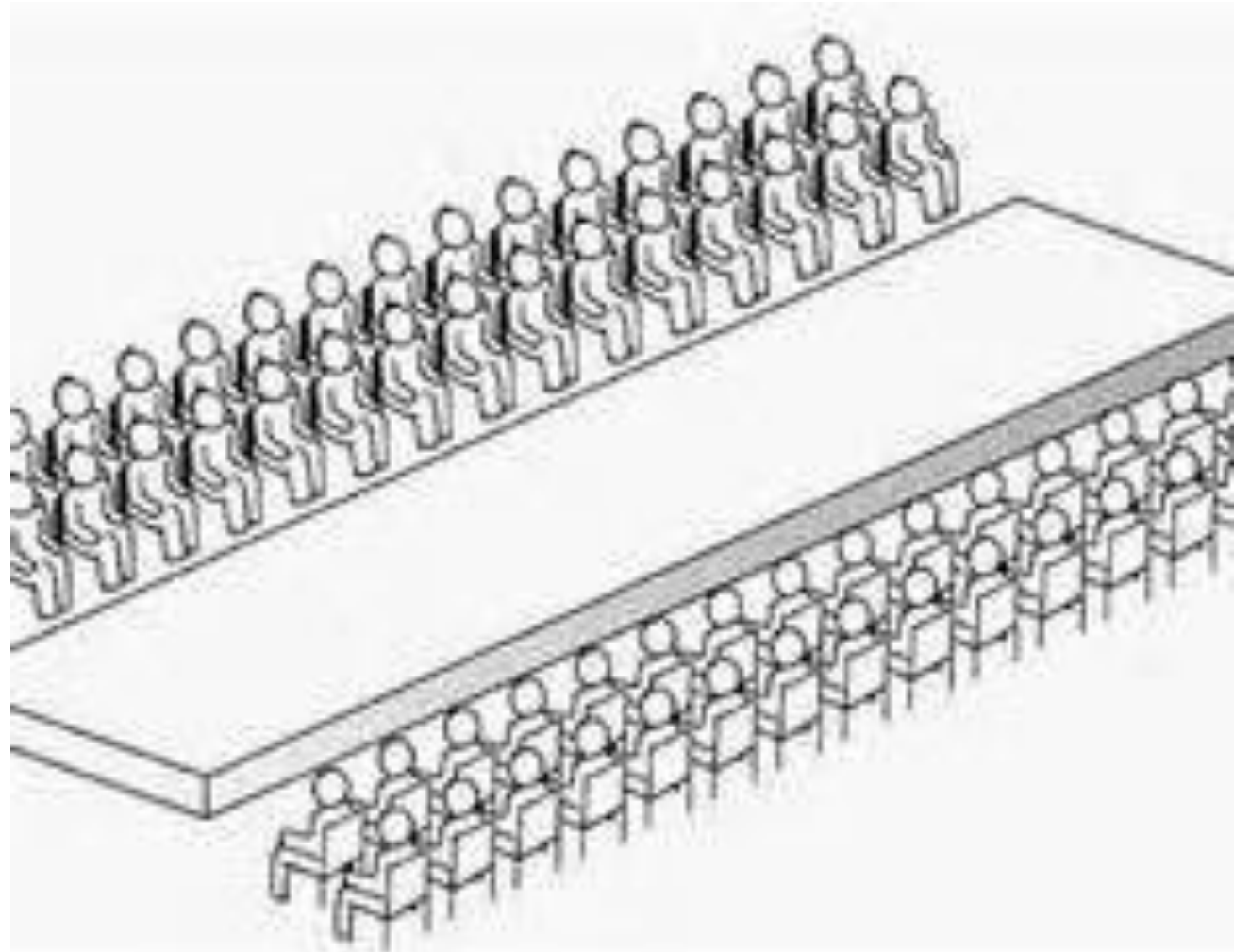

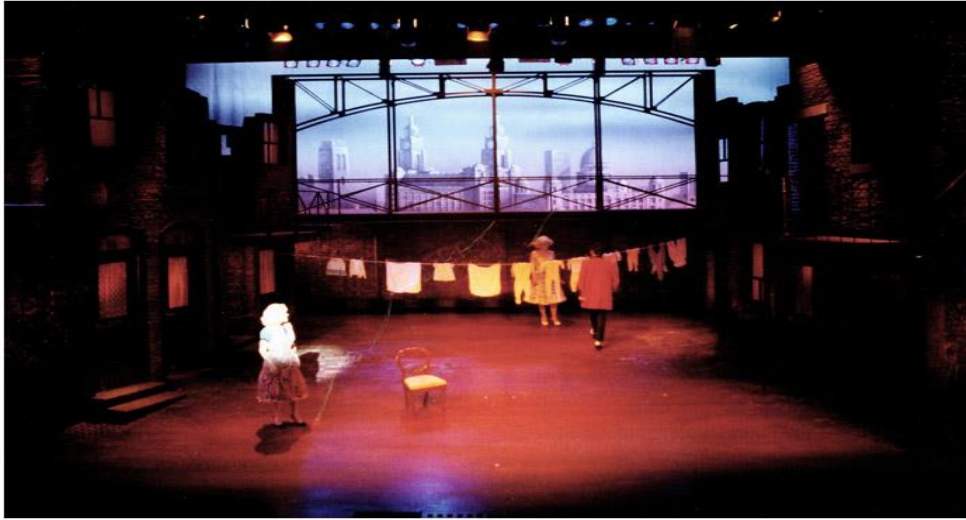
# Section B: Character profiles and costumes in Blood Brothers

- Parent asks son/daughter to write an 8 bullet point description of a character costume for an extract from the play including hair and make up. The costume must be appropriate for: 1970's Liverpool and must reflect the age, status and personality of the character. The impact on the audience of this costume must also be included in the bullet points
- Parent asks son/daughter to write 5: adjectives for each character ( state age of Mickey/ Eddie)
  - adverbs for how that character would stand, walk, move, gesture, talk





# Set design for Blood Brothers



- Parent randomly selects a two page extract from the play and asks son/daughter to explain/ draw/ write bullet points or description of that set. The set must have visual elements that clearly show that the context of this play is 1970s/ 1980s Liverpool when there was high unemployment due to Thatcher's cuts and a clear distinction between the Upper class and the working class. The set must be relevant for **THAT EXTRACT** NOT THE WHOLE PLAY.

# Section C: Comedy About A Bank Robbery

- Take your son/daughter to see the play again and to add to notes on acting in the Act 1 sc 3 and Act 1 sc 5. Parent to ask son/daughter to explain how Holly Sumpton impressed you with her acting skills when on three phones and how Sam Fogell impressed with his acting skills and who was better and why?
- Students create flash cards of each character listing in bullet points useful adjectives and adverbs of how they used their face, body, voice, use of space to make that role convincing – parent tests them.
- Student explains to parent how he/she will plan/structure an essay on acting
