Who is the club aimed at?

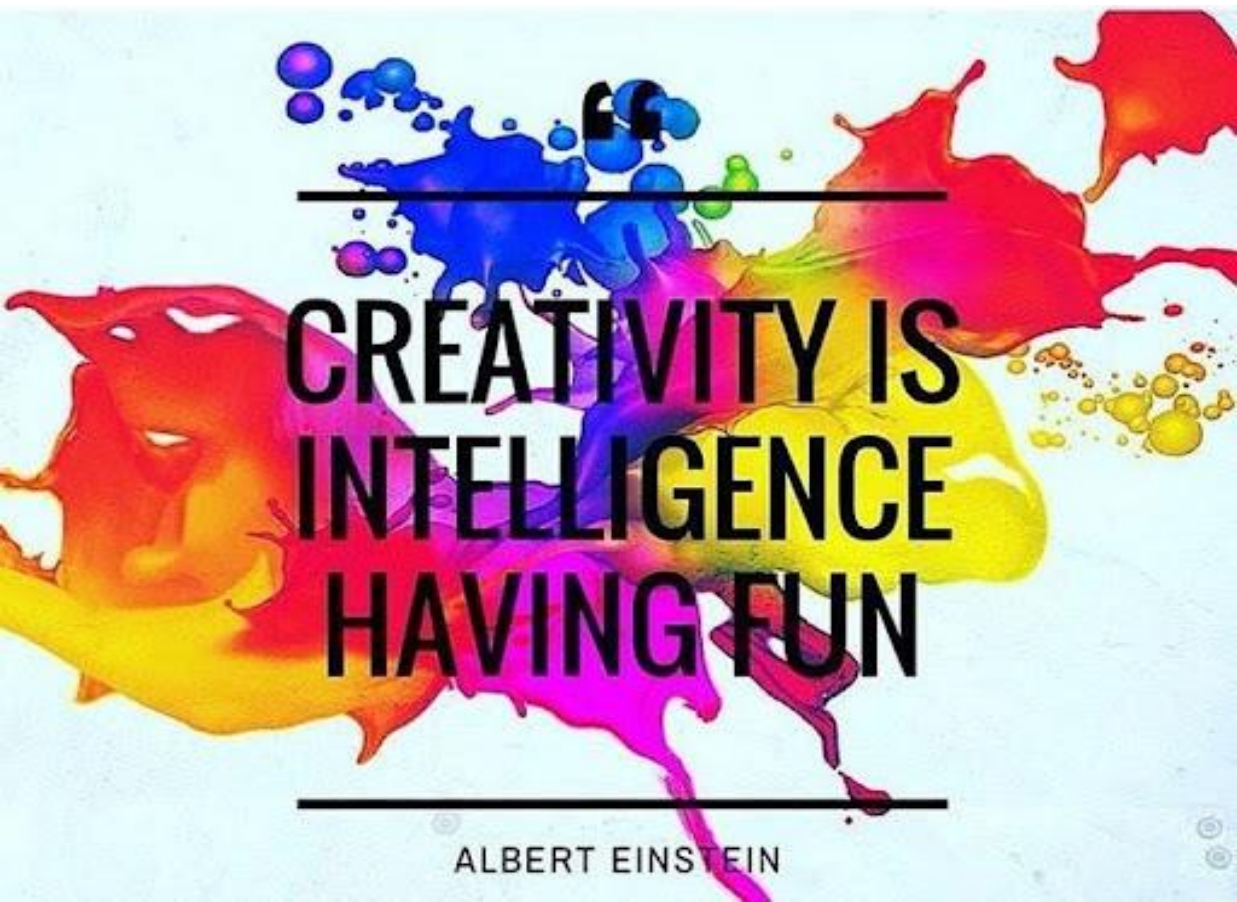
All students

Who is the club aimed at?

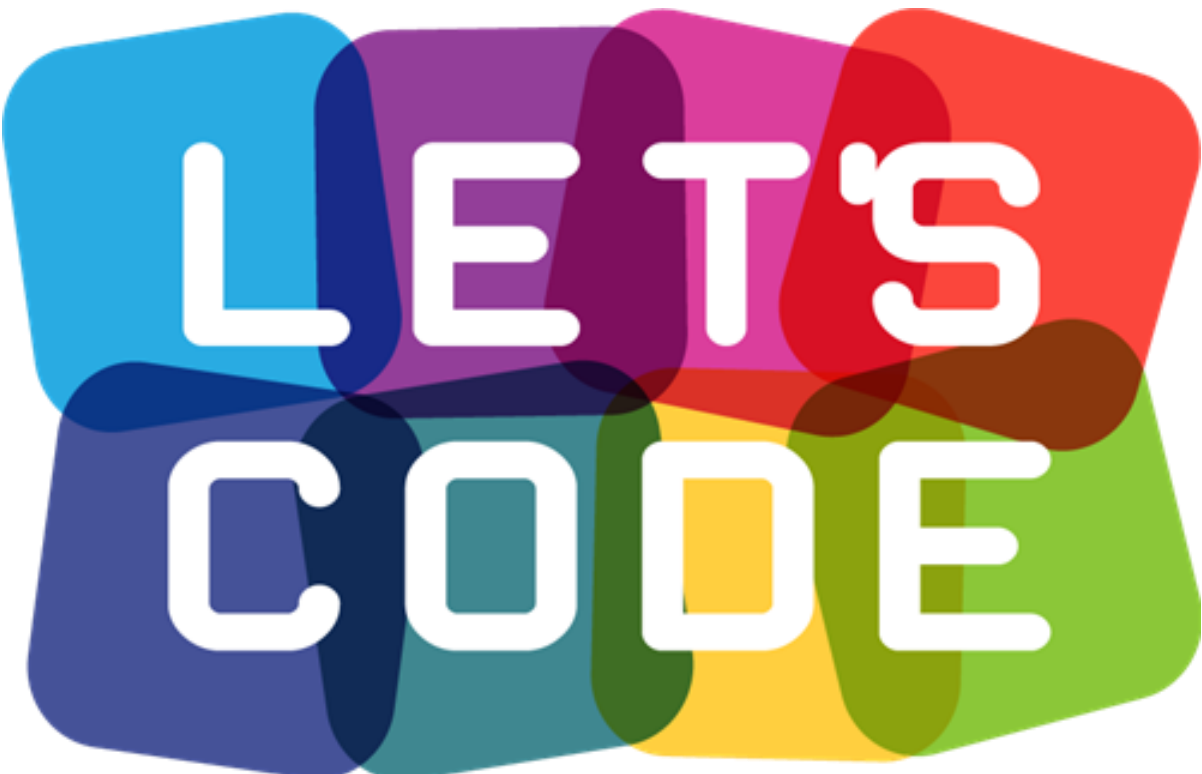
Year 9 and 10 students doing GCSE Computer Science.

Who is the club aimed at?

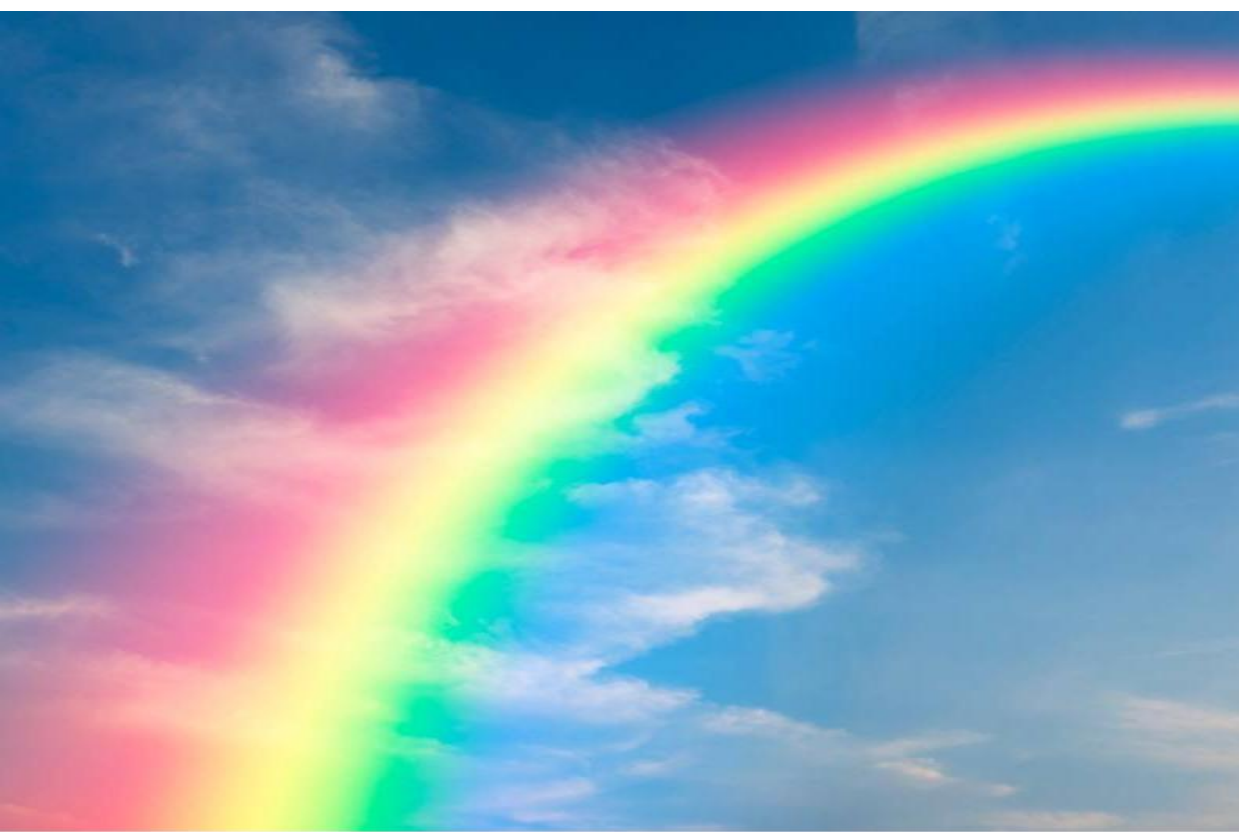
LGBT+ community and allies in all year groups.
